**AFFIDAVIT OF
LYNDON SCHEVECK**

Lyndon Scheveck, being first duly sworn, deposes and states:

(1) In May 2016, I graduated from Appalachian School of Law located in Grundy, Virginia. It is an American Bar Association accredited law school. I did well academically. I graduated with a certificate of Natural Resources. The Dean of Appalachian School of Law, Sandra McGlothlin, can attest to my academic abilities.

(2) On February 21 and 22, 2017, I sat for the Montana Bar Examination in Helena, Montana. On February 21, 2017, during the multistate essay examination

(MEE) and the multistate performance test (MPT), one of the proctors caused a disturbance throughout that portion of the examination by coughing and moving about as if he was intentionally trying to disturb the examination. I, as well as several other applicants, complained several times about the proctor's disruptive behavior. The proctor refused to leave the testing area. The proctor continued to disrupt the testing center. I was sitting in close proximity to the disruptive proctor. The proctor's disruptive behavior distracted me from the examination.

(3) On April 12, 2017, I received the examination results. I received a 140.3 on the multistate bar examination (MBE), a 121.4 on the combination of the multistate performance test (MPT) and on the multistate essay examination (MEE). I received a total score of a 262. I needed a 266 to pass the examination. I failed to pass the examination by 4.3 points. My MBE score placed me approximately in the 70-percentile range. My score of a 140.3 is well above the national average of a 133 MBE based on the February 2017 exam. The MBE is tested on the second day of testing, February 22. The proctor who was causing the disturbance was not present. The combined MEE and MPT score placed me in the bottom half of the test takers. The MBE and the MEE test on the same general areas of law.

(4) On April 19, 2017, I requested the Montana Board of Bar Examiners credit me with the 4.3 points I needed to pass the examination because of the proctor's disruptive behavior during the examination that distracted me from the examination. On

April 26, 2017, the Board declined my request. The Board found that there was no authority to grant such relief.

Pursuant to the Rules of Admission of the Montana Supreme Court:

III. (H) POST-EXAMINATION REVIEW

The Board of the Bar Examiners' pass/fail decisions are final and not subject to review additional substantive review once the report is filed with the Bar Admissions Administrator.


(5) Before the scores were filed with the Bar Admissions Administrator, the Bar Administrator promptly reported the incident to the Board of Bar Examiners as under Rule 103D of the Montana Supreme Court Board of Bar Examiners' Rule. The Board of Bar Examiners knew of the incident before the results of the Universal Bar Exam were released. The Bar Administrator notified the Board of Bar Examiners that there could be a possible impact on the scores. When the Universal Bar Exam scores were released, the Bar Administrator notified the Board of Bar Examiners that there were scores that were apparently impacted. There are currently no rules set by the Montana Supreme Court pertaining to this issue.



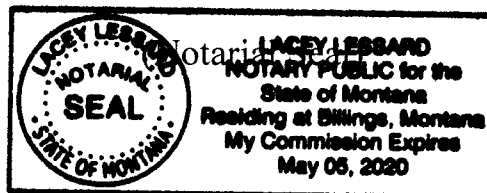


