WHEREAS, heretofore on the 8th day of March, 1990, this Court upon the recommendation of its Committee on Appropriate Technology, by order proposed standards of computerization to be used by all courts in Montana, and asked for comments thereon for a period of 60 days from the date of said order, after which the Court would consider whether to reject or adopt such standards in whole or in part, and

WHEREAS, it appears that it is necessary to adopt such standards to be effective immediately.


IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that all of the proposed computerization standards set forth in this Court's order dated the 8th day of March, 1990, are adopted and in force effective immediately.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the original period for comments will continue after which time the Court will consider whether to alter, modify or vacate the same in whole or in part.




of each county within the State of Montana.
