Charles Bernard Parke petitions for a writ of habeas corpus, requesting relief because of his alleged illegal incarceration. Parke's request, arising from criminal cases brought against him in 1987 and 2003, is for this Court to either "[lessen] the [offense] charge or . . . remand this Cause to the district court directing the court to resentence [Parke] to a lesser [offense]" Parke acknowledges that his Montana sentences have been discharged, but asserts that his convictions are being held against him by the federal Bureau of Prisons and Probation Office. He contends that he is thus doing more time in the federal penal system and placed in a higher custody level. We amend the caption to indicate the Warden's name of MCFP Springfield, located in Missouri, where Parke is currently incarcerated. Section 46-22-201(1)(c), MCA.

Having discharged his sentences, Parke's petition is moot; the Court cannot grant him effective relief. *Sebastian v. Mahoney*, 2001 MT 88, ¶ 7, 305 Mont. 158, 25 P.3d 163. Parke is well past the time to challenge the gravity of the offenses charged against him, and there is nothing to remand when Parke has acknowledged that his sentences have been discharged.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Parke's Petition for a Writ of Habeas Corpus is DENIED and DISMISSED.
