O R D E R

Dale G. Casares has petitioned the Court to waive the three-year test requirement for the Multistate Professional Responsibility Examination (MPRE) for purposes of Casares' application for admission by motion to the State Bar of Montana. By rule, applicants for admission by motion must provide evidence of the requisite score on an MPRE taken "within three years preceding the date of the application for admission." Rule IV.A.3, Rules of Admission.

Casares passed the MPRE in 2012 when seeking admission to the practice of law in Colorado, where Casares was admitted. The petition states that Casares has practiced law for 8 years, "without any ethical or disciplinary actions in any jurisdiction." Casares explains that two grievances were lodged during this time, but both were dismissed by Colorado Regulation Counsel without notifying Petitioner of the existence of the grievances. Good cause appearing,


