possibility of being designated a vexatious litigant by the Montana Supreme Court. 1 2 The parenting case is currently being actively litigated giving rise to this Order. 3 As this guardianship case was in its initial stages, Jessica Smalling (Jessica) 4 filed a Motion for Contempt in the parenting case and Jason Klubben (Jason) sought 5 6 to amend the existing parenting plan. Both of those matters are still pending. 7 In this matter the Court held a hearing on February 11, 2021, and took 8 9 testimony from Margaret and Jessica. The Court then directed Jessica to 10 immediately submit to a drug test which she did. At subsequent hearings in this 11 matter Margaret and Fred agreed that Jessica's ability to parent was no longer 12 limited by circumstance but requested that this case remain open pending the 13 14 resolution of matters in the parenting case. The Court, in what in retrospect was an 15 undue desire for efficiency, denied that request and closed this case. 16 17 A hearing was held in the parenting case on April 15, 2021. Testimony was 18 taken from Jason, Margaret, and Jessica. From the testimony taken in both DG-19 2021-11 and DR-2016-476, the Court makes the following findings of fact and 20 conclusions of law. 21 22 FINDINGS OF FACT 23 1. Jessica and Jason are the biological parents of B.L.K. who is currently 7 24 years old. Jessica is 30 years old and Jason is 48 years old. 25 26 Finding of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order Establishing Temporary Guardianship

1	2. The Montana Supreme Court has previously affirmed this Court's jurisdiction
2	over the parenting of B.L.K.
3 4	3. Margaret and Fred are the parents of Jason. They are over the age of 18.
5	4. Margaret and Fred reside in the state of Washington outside of Spokane.
6	5. Jason resides in a fifth wheel camper trailer on his parent's property.
7 8	6. Jessica is residing temporarily with her mother and sister in the Corvallis area
9	in Montana.
10	7. B.L.K. has been residing with Margaret and Fred since August 8, 2020.
11 12	8. In August of 2020, Jessica agreed to have B.L.K. reside with Margaret and
13	Fred for the 2020-2021school year. Jessica was struggling with
14	methamphetamine addiction and wanted B.L.K. to live in a safe and stable
15 16	environment while she sought help for her addiction.
17	9. Jessica entered an inpatient drug treatment program in September of 2020.
18	10. Following the treatment program relations between Jessica and the entire
19	
20	Klubben family, but with Jason in particular, gradually degraded leading to
21	Jessica demanding in January of 2021 that B.L.K. be returned to her care
22	which has spawned all of the litigation involving this family which is
23	
24	currently pending before the Court.

1	11. Jessica was clean until March of 2020 when she relapsed and began using
2	methamphetamine again. She has enrolled in drug treatment which will
3	include random drug testing.
4	
5	12. Jessica agrees that her ability to parent B.L.K. is currently limited by her
6	addiction and agrees that Margaret and Fred should have temporary
7 8	guardianship of B.L.K. while she engages in treatment.
9	13. Jason testified that he is a highly involved parent and while he has recently
10	been limited by some physical problems, he is fully capable of parenting
11	
12	B.L.K. full time. He further testified that he is undergoing medical treatment
13	to resolve his physical problems.
14	14. Jessica testified that Jason is heavily dependent on marijuana and routinely
15 16	drives and parents while under the influence of THC. The Court finds this
17	testimony credible.
18	15. Jason testified that while he does drive, without a valid license, he does not
19	
20	do so while under the influence and that Jessica exaggerated his THC use. He
21	said he would be positive for THC if drug tested.
22	16. Jessica testified that Jason is minimally involved as a parent and that he
23	
24	spends his days getting high and playing on his computer. The Court finds
25	this testimony credible.

17. Margaret testified that Jason's involvement in parenting since B.L.K. has
lived with them has been limited to tucking her in at night and sometimes
having her spend the night with him in his trailer. She testified that she and
Fred handle all of the day-to-day care of B.L.K. and that this has been
unchanged since B.L.K. came to live with them. The Court finds the
testimony credible.
18. Jason does not agree to his parents being appointed as B.L.K.'s temporary
guardians.
19. Margaret testified that they are still willing to be guardians of B.L.K. but they
are hoping that B.L.K.'s parents can get to a point of being able to parent so
that Margaret and Fred can go back to being retired.
20. All witnesses agree that B.L.K. is safe, happy, and doing well in school while
in Margaret and Fred's care.
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW
1. The Court has jurisdiction of the parties and subject matter of this
proceeding and Margaret and Fred have agreed to venue by virtue of filing
the Petition with this Court.
2. Margaret and Fred are capable and qualified to serve as guardians of
the minor child.
