- 4. There are no disciplinary proceedings pending against Ms. Mech as a member of the Bar in any jurisdiction.
- 5. Ms. Mech has familiarized herself with the Local Rules of this Court, particularly including, but not limited to, the Montana Rules of Professional Conduct and the Montana Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 6. Ms. Mech has not previously appeared, or sought to appear, in any action in this Court and does not maintain a regular practice in the State of Montana. Hence, she has not abused the privilege to specially appear under the rules.

- 7. Herman and Ms. Mech designate and consent to the undersigned, Joseph Nevin, The Law Offices of Joseph Nevin, as the responsible attorney for the progress of the case. All notices and papers may be served upon Mr. Nevin. Mr. Nevin is a member in good standing of the Montana Bar and this Court, is a resident of Montana, and consents to act and accept the designation as local counsel for Herman.

MEMORANDUM OF LAW

Rule V of the Rules Governing Admission to the Bar of Montana states, in pertinent part,

Admission to the State Bar of Montana is governed by the Montana Supreme Court Commission on Character and Fitness and the Montana Supreme Court Board of Bar Examiners

B. Methods of Admission

Admission to the State Bar of Montana may be accomplished by four methods:

- 1. examination as provided in Rule III;
- 2. transfer of Uniform Bar Examination score from

another jurisdiction as provided in Rule IV;

- 3. admission on motion as provided in Rule V; and
- 4. pro hac vice appearance as provided in Rule VI.

Rule VI governs Pro Hac Vice admission:

- A. Upon written application, an attorney who is not admitted to practice law in the state courts of Montana and who is at the time admitted and authorized to practice law in the highest court of another state may, with leave of the presiding court, appear *pro hac vice* in any action or proceeding, if an attorney admitted to practice in the courts of Montana is associated as attorney of record.
- B. An attorney may not appear *pro hac vice* under this Rule if the attorney is a resident of Montana, is regularly employed in Montana, or is engaged in the practice of law or in substantial business or professional activities in Montana, unless the attorney has an application for admission pending with the Bar Admissions Administrator.

E. The completed application, along with a fee equal to the annual amount paid by active members of the Montana Bar, must be filed with the Bar Admissions Administrator.

As reflected in the Motion itself, Ms. Mech's candidacy meets all of the prerequisites of this Rule VI. Accordingly, Herman asks the Court to enter an Order admitting Ms. Mech *pro hac vice*.
