IN RE PETITION OF MARY CLAIRE TRIMBLE
TO WAIVE RULE X(B) REQUIRING ADMISSION WITHIN ONE YEAR
IN THE STATE BAR OF MONTANA

PETITION

COMES NOW Mary Claire Trimble and respectfully petitions this Court for admission to the State Bar of Montana, specifically for the Court to waive Rule X(B) requiring that applicants be sworn in within one year of notification, so that Trimble may be sworn in and finalize the admission process.

In its Order dated May 2, 2023, the Court stated:

To finish the admissions process, Trimble must petition the Court for admission, submitting the certification from the Bar Admissions Administrator that Trimble has satisfied all admissions requirements. Given the expiration of the one-year period in which to do so, Trimble must also request that the Court waive Rule X(B) by providing an explanation about why the process was not completed within one year.

Petitioner Trimble offers the letter from dated December 3, 2021, as proof of satisfaction of all requirements for admission to the Montana State Bar [Exhibit A].

In addition, the following is an explanation of why Trimble was not sworn in within one year of admission: In brief, petitioner was newly employed with the City of Missoula in a position that did not require bar admission and subsequently became pregnant with a high-risk pregnancy. These two factors combined meant that bar admission was not a priority during a time when limited personal leave was being used for medical appointments and saved for maternity leave.

In April 2021, Petitioner was laid off from employment with the federal court (USDC District of Oregon) and determined to move back to her hometown of Missoula, quickly completing all requirements to take the Montana July bar exam. In August, Trimble then accepted employment with the City of Missoula as the Senior Deputy City Clerk. This position, though legally adjacent, does not require a law degree and does not file or appear before any court. Trimble was notified of her admission in December. As a new employee Trimble had limited personal leave during this period of employment and in July 2022, Trimble became pregnant and was diagnosed with a high risk pregnancy, requiring additional leave for numerous specialist visits. While working full time, dealing with health complications from the pregnancy, and needing to diligently bank personal leave for maternity leave, completing admission to the bar was unfortunately not a priority. Happily, Trimble welcomed a healthy baby girl in March and is now requesting permission to resume the admission process.

Initially, petitioner voluntarily chose inactive status but would currently like to be sworn in and admitted to active status. Petitioner is willing and able to pay active dues, fees, and the state license tax to the State Bar of Montana and comply with any continuing education requirements this Court may impose.

Petitioner is <u>not</u> actively practicing law in another jurisdiction. Petitioner has <u>not</u> been employed as a law clerk while on inactive status. Petitioner is <u>not</u> currently suspended, disbarred, or otherwise ineligible to practice law in another jurisdiction. Petitioner is <u>not</u> currently subject to disciplinary proceedings or pending disciplinary proceedings in another jurisdiction. Petitioner has <u>not</u> been charged with a criminal offense while not on active status. Petitioner has <u>not</u> accrued delinquent debt or filed for bankruptcy while not on active status. Petitioner has <u>not</u> failed to fulfill the obligations of a public office or professional license (other than as an attorney) while not on active status. Finally, petitioner has <u>not</u> committed any acts or omissions while not on active status which would be sanctionable under the Montana Rules of Professional Conduct.

WHEREFORE, petitioner requests the Court waive Rule X(2) and permit Petitioner to be sworn into the State Bar of Montana; or whatever order of operations this Court deems appropriate to move forward.
