COMES NOW John R. Prater, your Petitioner herein, and submits his verified Petition as follows:

- 1. That he was admitted to practice law in Montana in 1968.
- 2. That he was licensed, on active status, and continuously practiced in Montana until 1983.
- 3. That thereafter, he moved to Colorado and became licensed in that State in 1984 and is presently licensed, on active status, and current in his Continuing Legal Education requirements in the State of Colorado, as evidenced by copy of Certificate of Good Standing (Exhibit A), and transcript of completed Continuing Legal Education courses for the compliance period of January 1, 1993, and continuing through December 31, 1996 (Exhibit B).



I was involved in Indian water rights negotiations and litigation in Montana and Wyoming, and worked closely with Department of Justice and Solicitor's Office attorneys in developing strategies for asserting and defending Indian reserved water rights.

Although I have been on inactive status since my admission to the State Bar, I have completed continuing legal education this year. On April 10-11, 1996, I attended the Federal Bar Association's 21st Annual Indian Law Conference in Albuquerque (application attached). This conference has been approved by the Federal Bar Association Continuing Legal Education Board for 12.25 credit hours.

About the Conference The Twenty First Aims Federal Bar Association Indian Law Conference once again brings together many outstanding leaders in the field of Federal Indian Lawfor in-depth presentation on a broad range of topics critical to the development of Federal Indian law. The United States Supreme Court, the Congress, the Executive Branch, and tribal courts and legislatures are more active than ' ever in addressing Native American issues, and this year's Conference will note the direction and im-

plications of these activities in a variety of areas.
