On her own behalf, Cheyenne Rae Dawn Petersen has filed a Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus, indicating illegal incarceration concerning her pending criminal case in the First Judicial District Court, Lewis and Clark County. She includes several hundred pages of attachments that appear to be filings from the District Court case.

As a threshold matter, Petersen's Petition is single-spaced and nineteen pages. M. R. App. P. 14(9)(b) provides that the text of a petition shall not "exceed 4,000 words if proportionally spaced or 12 pages if prepared in a monospaced typeface or if typewritten." Her Petition is overlength. We observe that she has counsel to represent her in her District Court proceeding. M. R. App. P. 10(1)(c). According to the court's register of actions that we secured, the District Court has held a motion hearing after the jury trial's conclusion in April. Petersen's remedy is not with this Court.

The remedy of habeas corpus is not a substitute for a direct appeal. An appeal is the proper forum in which to litigate any objections and issues concerning her conviction and sentence. *State v. Wright*, 2001 MT 282, ¶¶ 36-37, 307 Mont. 349, 42 P.3d 753; § 46-22-101(2), MCA. Petersen's remedy is to file an appeal after she has received a written, final judgment from the District Court. Therefore,

IT IS ORDERED that Petersen's Petition for Writ of Habeas Corpus is DISMISSED.
